White Christmas


INGREDIENTS

- 250g copha[®]*
- 3 cups Kellogg's® Rice Bubbles®
- 1 cup desiccated coconut
- ¾ cup icing sugar, sifted
- 1 cup powdered milk
- 1 cup packaged, dried mixed fruit glacè cherries for topping

DIRECTIONS

- Combine dry ingredients in a mixing bowl.
- Melt copha slowly over low heat.
- Cool slightly, pour onto dry ingredients. Mix well.
- Working quickly spoon into paper patty cases or press into a lamington tin.
- Freeze until set (about 15 minutes), then store in the refrigerator.
- Serve cut into fingers and topped with glace cherries.
