Yesterday Mark Scott, Secretary of the Department of Education, announced that schools would adopt social distancing measures in schools as a precaution, to keep the risk of infection minimal. Evacuation and Lock Down Drill

Each year, schools are required to have emergency evacuation and lock down drills to ensure all children, staff and visitors are aware of procedures in the unlikely event of an emergency. At BPS we have clearly defined procedures which we will be practising with all students during drills throughout the year. Due to social distancing measures, the orientation drill organised for Wednesday 25 March will now be postponed. Instead we will coordinate a modified drill on this day which will outline the procedures and step through the processes of these drills within their classroom environment. Students will be made aware before the day that this will occur.

Tell Them From Me Survey

Like many other public schools in the state, our school will participate in a Department of Education initiative: The Tell Them From Me (TTFM) student feedback survey. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices. The TTFM survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them.

The survey is confidential and is conducted online. It typically takes less than 30 minutes to complete and will be administered during school hours before the 8th May. An 'opt-out' consent form and FAQs for parents/carers about the survey will be sent home with students today.



NSW Premier's Reading Challenge:

NSW Premier, Gladys Berejiklian is encouraging school students to find the same joy in books that she has had since she was a child.

The challenge is not a competition, but a way to foster a love of reading for pleasure in Kindergarten to year 9 students in NSW schools.

This year, **Brooklyn Public School** will be entering the challenge and all students are encouraged to participate. Mrs Broome is the PRC Co-ordinator at our school.

The 2020 Challenge commences on March 2nd and finishes on August 28th, 2020. Many of the books on the lists can be borrowed from the Brooklyn School Library.

A certain number of books must be read to complete the challenge:

K-2 students are to read 30 PRC books on their own, read with someone, or <u>have read to them</u>. 3-4 & 5-6 students are to read 20 PRC books on their own.

Class teachers and Mrs Broome will record the books we **read to** K-2 students at school on each student's reading record. PRC booklists are updated each term and new books added.

Parents are encouraged to help their child to logon and record the books on the PRC student website at home using the same student logon that they use at school.

Premier's Reading Challenge

Tips for parents and carers for participating in the Challenge

D Find out the name(s) of your school's Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) coordinator(s) and how they plan to administer the Challenge.

D Familiarise yourself with the new <u>PRC student website</u>. There is a video on the <u>PRC Support site that</u> <u>you can watch that demonstrates how login, search for books and add them to a Student Reading Record</u> (SRR).

- D Visit the <u>Premier's Reading Challenge Support website</u>. It allows you to search for information about the PRC and how to use the PRC website and also how to <u>contact the PRC team</u>.
- D Set reminders for Challenge opening and closing dates in your and your child's calendar.
- D Find out your child's logon details. For public schools, students' logon will be the same one they use to

access computers and the internet at school. Non-government students will need to contact the PRC Coordinator at their school if they cannot remember their login details.

- D Assist your child to borrow books from the school or local library. Listen to your child read and talk about the story/ characters/ information. Read to or with your child if she/he is participating in the K-2 Challenge.
- D Help your child to add books to her/his Student Reading Record regularly.
- D Follow The Arts Unit on Facebook and the NSW PRC on Instagram to keep up to date about information about the Challenge throughout the year. We regularly run contests and Author events your child may be interested in taking part in.
- D Contact your child's **PRC coordinator** if:
 - Your child has any difficulty using her/his logon details to access the PRC website.
 - You are concerned that your child's name is spelt incorrectly in the PRC website.
 - If you need to check your child's Challenge history, please contact your child's PRC coordinator.
- D Your child's online Student Reading Record must have the required number of books recorded to complete the Challenge by **the** <u>student closing date</u>. School PRC coordinators have an extra two weeks to validate the SRR. **Only students with a validated SRR are eligible for a certificate**.
- D In the final weeks of the Challenge, log on regularly to the website to check the status of your child's SRR. Contact your child's PRC coordinator if you are concerned your child's SRR has not been validated.
