Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Kindergarten Orientation

Over the last couple of weeks, we have welcomed our 2021 kindergarten students as part of our Kindergarten Transition Program. We were amazed with how quickly they settled and engaged in the activities within the classroom. It was great to see them so excited and ready to start school. If you have a child who is due to start school next year and who is not yet enrolled, please enrol them now. If you know of anyone in our catchment area who has a child due to start school next year, please ask them to contact the school office. It is essential that the school is aware of all enrolments for planning purposes.

2021 Start to the School Year

The beginning of the 2021 school year will be a little different to previous years. Our staff will be at school for two school development days (Wednesday 27 and Thursday 28 January). Students will return to school on Friday 29 January. For our new Kindergarten students this will be their very first day of school. They will enjoy having the whole school to themselves on this day, while the rest of the students from Year 1-6 attend the Brooklyn/Cowan Combined Swimming Carnival.

Naidoc Week 2020

This year NAIDOC week was held on 8-15 November with the theme "Always Was, Always Celebrations Will Be". are held across Australia. It's a time to reflect and celebrate the history, culture and achievements of the First Nation peoples - recognising them as the traditional custodians of the land. To celebrate NAIDOC week at Brooklyn Public School, students learnt about some of the history of NAIDOC week and why it is important to celebrate this event. Aboriginal people share their knowledge about their culture through stories and art. Brooklyn students designed their own 'hand art' using dot painting to convey meaning in their designs.

They were displayed beautifully in the garden near the flag poles to represent the theme "Always Was, Always Will Be".

Whole School Presentation Assembly -Wednesday 9 December

Our school's Annual Presentation Day Assembly will be held at school on Wednesday 9th December, 2020.

Like everything this year, it will be a little different to previous years. Unfortunately under the current COVID-19 guidelines, and taking into account our school context and the ability to meet those guidelines, it will not be possible for all parents to attend the assembly. This year, we have decided to invite Year 6 parents, parents of inducted leaders and parents of award recipients only. As you can appreciate, primary school graduation is a special time and this will be the Year 6 students' final assembly for their primary school years. Only 1 family member per Year 6 student, inducted leader or award recipient will be able to attend the assembly. If you have more than one child receiving an award or included in any of these groups, only 1 family member per household will be able to attend.

The assembly will take place outdoors under the Covered Outdoor Learning Area (COLA). Invited guests will need to view the assembly from under the large tree outside the administration building, spaced 1.5 meters apart, in order to adhere to current guidelines. The assembly will be held at 11am in order to adhere to the 4 square metre rule and provide enough shade for guests in attendance. Guests will not be able to mingle and must remain seated for the duration of the assembly. Further information will be sent out shortly to these participating families.

For those parents/carers not in attendance, we will be recording the assembly for all Brooklyn families to view. A link to this assembly recording will be emailed at a later date.

Keeping Our Kids Safe Around Schools

The Keeping our kids safe around schools (PDF 1.5Mb) fact sheets have road safety information for families and the wider school community.

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The ten fact sheets provide information on:

- 1. Keeping your children safe when dropping off and picking up at school.
- 2. Walking together safely to and from school.
- 3. Keeping children safe in and out of the car.
- 4. Hold your child's hand.
- 5. Wearing helmets and riding safely.
- 6. Your guide to driving and parking safely near schools.
- 7. Keeping safe around school crossings.
- 8. 40km/h school zones.
- 9. Driving safely near school buses.
- 10. Helping children on and off the bus safely.

School Travel for 2021

2021 school travel applications are now open



Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now <u>apply</u> online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should re-apply or update their details.

*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new <u>eligibility criteria</u>, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before **31 December 2020** to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator, this may be distributed via the school or sent direct to their address. Note: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/Parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

New Concession Entitlement Cards

Transport for NSW will be replacing the below cards with Transport Concession Entitlement Cards (TCEC) from October 2020:

- Senior Secondary Student Concession Card (16 years and over) also used by Mature Secondary Students (18 years and over), Distance Education Students and Home School Students
- · Proof of Age card (when a student under 16 years of age looks older)
- Boarder Rail Pass.

All previous cards will be valid until they expire. Students who require a Transport Concession Entitlement Card should speak with their school administration staff.
