PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

[Changes to School Development Days in 2021](#)

At the commencement of 2021, there will be amendments to our School Developments Days (SDD's). These amendments will impact Term 1 and 4, but will have no impact on Terms 2 and 3. As a result of the changes there will no longer be two Staff Developments Days at the end of Term 4. Instead, there will be two Staff Developments Days at beginning of the school year.

The 2021 school year will commence with two Staff Development Days. **Therefore, for students in Years 1-6 the first day of school for 2021 will be Friday 29 January.** This change will mean that the first day of school for Year 1-6, will be the day of our school Swimming Carnival. Further details about this event will be communicated to you towards the end of Term 4.

[COVID-19: Updated Advice for NSW Schools](#)

Schools should continue to exclude students and staff with even mild cold or flu symptoms and encourage them to seek testing immediately. **Parents of symptomatic children will still need to provide evidence of a negative test result before their child can return to school.**

In the case of seasonal allergic rhinitis or other condition that presents similarly to COVID-19 and in the presence of continuing symptoms, **the child will need a negative COVID-19 test result and a letter from their GP confirming that the child should be permitted to return to school.** If the child's symptoms change from their usual symptoms, a repeat of the COVID-19 testing should be performed.

Non-essential adults should continue to be excluded from school unless involved directly in delivery of curriculum activities or health services. All teachers, coaches and volunteers should continue to ensure they maintain physical distancing during, before and after school or sporting events.

Good hand hygiene practices should continue to be supported along with the other measures outlined in the school and community sports COVID-19 Safety Plan.



What's happening in 6/5/4W

6/5/4W have again been busy, with lots going on as we returned to school in Term 4. Preparation for the Stage 3 Mini Fair has been undertaken with enthusiasm and excitement by students as they began working together to create a range of activities that will entertain and provide a fun filled time for the school.

We have also been fortunate to access the Department STEM share learning library, borrowing the tablet robotics kit for Term 4. 6/5/4W have been eagerly exploring beginning coding through the use of WeDo Lego kits and Dash Robots. Students have worked collaboratively in small groups to create mini Lego robots and then program them to move about the classroom, building on a sensor attachment to ensure minimal crashes! The Dash robots proved entertaining as they sometimes have a mind of their own! We will continue to explore and develop our coding skills as we move through the term.



In science this week, Stage 3 discussed and explored electricity and circuits. Students began drawing and building simple circuits to turn on a light bulb, drive a motor and sound a buzzer.

Last Thursday, Stage 3 hosted their first Mini Fair. After lots of preparation and fingers crossed that the weather would hold out, the fair began with excited squeals from the younger grades. 

BOOK CHARACTER PARADE



School Travel for 2021

2021 school travel applications are now open



Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now [apply](#) online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should [re-apply or update their details](#).

*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new [eligibility criteria](#), they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

[Term Bus Pass](#) holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to <https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails>

Applications need to be submitted before **31 December 2020** to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator, this may be distributed via the school or sent direct to their address. **Note:** some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/Parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

New Concession Entitlement Cards

Transport for NSW will be replacing the below cards with Transport Concession Entitlement Cards (TCEC) from October 2020:

- Senior Secondary Student Concession Card (16 years and over) – also used by Mature Secondary Students (18 years and over), Distance Education Students and Home School Students
- Proof of Age card (when a student under 16 years of age looks older)
- Boarder Rail Pass.

All previous cards will be valid until they expire. Students who require a Transport Concession Entitlement Card should speak with their school administration staff.
