Dear Parents and Caregivers,

### Welcome Back

Welcome back to Term 4. I hope everyone had a relaxing break and was able to enjoy the wonderful weather and time spent with your families.

### COVID-19: Updated Advice for NSW Schools

Schools should continue to exclude students and staff with even mild cold or flu symptoms and encourage them to seek testing immediately. **Parents of symptomatic children will still need to provide evidence of a negative test result before their child can return to school**.

In the case of seasonal allergic rhinitis or other conditions that present similarly to COVID-19 and in the presence of continuing symptoms, the child will need a negative COVID-19 test result and a letter from their GP confirming that the child should be permitted to return to school. If the child's symptoms change from their usual symptoms, a repeat of the COVID-19 testing should be performed.

Non-essential adults should continue to be excluded from school unless involved directly in delivery of curriculum activities or health services. All teachers, coaches and volunteers should continue to ensure they maintain physical distancing during, before and after school or sporting events.

Good hand hygiene practices should continue to be supported along with the other measures outlined in the school and community sports COVID-19 Safety Plan.

#### Summer Uniform

Students are now able to wear the school Summer uniform. Please ensure that all jackets, jumpers, lunch boxes etc are well labelled with your child/ren's names.

### Kindergarten Enrolments

Kindergarten enrolments are due now. Our School administration team are currently accepting enrolment applications and supporting documentation for students commencing in 2021. Future Kindergarten students should be enrolled as soon as possible to ensure that we can communicate information about Orientation Programs.

### Book Week

We will be holding our Book Character Parade for students this Thursday 22 October. Students are encouraged to dress up as their favourite book character. Unfortunately, parents are unable to join us this year, but we will endeavour to share photos of children on the day. The parade will be held in class groups throughout the day rather than as a whole school event. Children will wear their costumes to school on the day of the parade.

### <u>Selective High School 2022 – Information for</u> <u>current Year 5 students</u>

Selective high schools cater for intellectually gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates of their own academic standard. Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability and using specialised teaching methods to support the learning needs of gifted students.

Applications for Year 7 entry to selective high schools in 2022 will be accepted from Tuesday 13 October 2020 to Monday 16 November 2020.

All applicants are required to sit the Selective High School Placement Test to be held on Thursday 11 March 2021.

# **School Travel for 2021**

2021 school travel applications are now open



Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now <u>apply</u> online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should re-apply or update their details.

\*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new <u>eligibility criteria</u>, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to <a href="https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails">https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails</a>

Applications need to be submitted before **31 December 2020** to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator, this may be distributed via the school or sent direct to their address. Note: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/Parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

### **New Concession Entitlement Cards**

Transport for NSW will be replacing the below cards with Transport Concession Entitlement Cards (TCEC) from October 2020:

- Senior Secondary Student Concession Card (16 years and over) also used by Mature Secondary Students (18 years and over), Distance Education Students and Home School Students
- · Proof of Age card (when a student under 16 years of age looks older)
- · Boarder Rail Pass.

All previous cards will be valid until they expire. Students who require a Transport Concession Entitlement Card should speak with their school administration staff.
