Dear Parents and Caregivers,

COVID-19 Update—Easing Restrictions

As you are aware, from Monday 8th March, parents and carers are now permitted to enter the school grounds to drop off their children between 8:30am-9:00am and pick-up from 3:00pm whilst following COVID-safe practices, including social distancing between adults of 1.5 metres. Attendance at sporting events will also be permitted subject to COVID-19 Safety Plans of particular venues.

When entering the school grounds at all other times, it is important parents and carers have an appointment/invitation and come to the office and sign into the school.

It is still imperative that we all remain vigilant in implementing COVID-safe practices in our school. Some level of restrictions and guidelines will remain in place for schools for some time.

Parents and carers are reminded that students must not attend school if they are unwell, even with the mildest of symptoms. Students must return a negative COVID-19 test and be symptom free for three days prior to returning to school.

I thank everyone for their patience and understanding.

Communication

The school encourages regular contact between parents/carers and teachers. Two-way communication is key to building productive partnerships and to nurture and support each student's learning journey. If you have any queries regarding your child's learning, the first point of contact should be your child's classroom teacher. If you have any queries regarding policy or teaching staff, I can be contacted via the school's general email account and I will reply to you as soon as I can. For more urgent matters or if you need to escalate your issue, please contact me through the school office.

Director, Educational Leadership Visit

Last Tuesday, the relieving Director Educational Leadership, for the Mooney Mooney Principal Network, Jonathan Moxon, visited Brooklyn Public School. Jonathan spent some time with me discussing our school's new 4-year Strategic Improvement Plan (SIP). It was exciting to share with Jonathan the wonderful learning that has taken place at Brooklyn PS over the last 12-18 months as well as the future directions of the school as we strive for continuous improvement.

Student Parliament

As part of the education program to support the students within the school, our local Police Youth Liaison Officer came to visit Brooklyn PS last Tuesday. Senior Constable Lewis Peters ran two sessions, one for Years 3 & 4 and one for Years 5 & 6, providing education around cyber safety, cyber bullying and the appropriate use of devices. The students were extremely engaged in the content and gained a lot of valuable information, knowledge and skills they need to stay safe in online environments.

Tell Them From Me

Like many other public schools in the State, our school will participate in a Department of Education initiative: The Tell Them From Me (TTFM) student feedback survey. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

The TTFM survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them.

The survey is confidential and is conducted online. It typically takes less than 30 minutes to complete and will be administered during school hours. An 'opt-out' consent form and FAQs for parents/carers about the survey was sent home with students on 2nd March.

<u>Moving Into Year 7 in a</u> <u>NSW Government School in 2021</u>

Documentation for the 2021-2022 Year 6 to 7 enrolment process was sent home with students last Wednesday 11th March 2021. Your child's designated local secondary school was entered on the Expression of Interest form. Parents or carers should return the completed Expression of Interest form to the school no later than Friday 19th March 2021.

Best Start Feedback to Parent Reports

The Best Start Kindergarten Assessment helps teachers identify the literacy and numeracy skills of each student when they start Kindergarten. The information gathered has already helped teachers to develop effective learning programs that build upon what each child knows and can do when they start Kindergarten. Today, a 'Feedback to Parent Report' will be sent home with Kindergarten students.





This report indicates the things your child was able to do during the assessment, and some areas that they will continue focusing on throughout the year at Brooklyn Public School. Today, bookings for parent teacher interviews for Kindergarten will open. During this one-on-one interview, you will be provided with feedback on how you can best support your child during their first year of school. The parent teacher interview will provide you with an opportunity to discuss your child's individual student achievement and ask any questions you have about your child's Best Start 'Feedback to Parent Report'.

Parent Teacher Interview

We have planned for parents and carers to meet with their child's classroom teacher in formal interviews during Week 9 (Kindergarten) and Week 10 (Years 1-6) of this term. All class teachers will have some morning, afternoon and evening sessions available to meet with each child's parent/carer individually. Online booking details will be sent home with students today. These meetings are an ideal opportunity to gain the teacher's current perspective and also for you to share information with the class teacher about your child. Please look out for the information regarding the online booking of interviews and follow the instructions to ensure that you don't miss out!

End of Term Assembly

We are excited to announce that this year's first End of Term Assembly is able to go ahead with parents in attendance.

The assembly will take place outdoors under the Covered Outdoor Learning Area (COLA). Invited guests will need to view the assembly from under the large tree outside the administration building, spaced 1.5 meters apart, in order to adhere to current guidelines. The assembly will be held at 12:00pm in order to adhere to the 4 square meter rule and provide enough shade for guests in attendance. Guests will not be able to mingle and must remain seated for the duration of the assembly. Only parents of students receiving an award will be invited to the assembly. Information will be sent out to these participating families in the coming week.

MindQuest 2021 Glenwood HS Cnr Forman Ave and Glenwood Park Dr Saturday & Sunday 22 & 23 May 2021





- mushrooms sliced or left whole
- If fresh veg isn't possible, try canned or frozen vegetables instead.
