PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Staying COVID (and Flu/RSV) Smart

With NSW Health projecting case numbers for both Influenza and COVID-19 to rise significantly over these coming weeks, we need to reiterate our ongoing recommendations and requests in the interest of keeping our students and staff safe and well. Please keep your children at home if they are feeling unwell or displaying any symptoms at all. Our teachers and school administration staff will be contacting you to collect any students who are unwell. It is important that students return to school only when symptom-free and after recording a negative RAT or PCR test. COVID positive students must await the mandatory 7-days isolation regardless, and wearing a mask for the first three days back at school is preferable. Students identified as close contacts remain able to attend school providing, they are symptom free, notify the school and return a negative COVID-19 test result daily for 5 consecutive school days. Primary students are strongly encouraged to wear a mask for 5 consecutive school days (except when eating/drinking or exercising). Please note that students identified as close contacts are still unable to attend overnight excursions, including camps. Visitors identified as close contacts who are engaging directly with students are required to return a negative COVID-19 test result before attending our school and wear a mask.

We strongly encourage the wearing of face masks when you are moving in and out of the school, especially in the afternoons. Thanks to the many parents who are already doing this to keep our students safe. Last Tuesday, we distributed another 5 RAT test kits to each student to be used at home in the event of any symptoms of COVID-19 appearing, however obviously a PCR test will also indicate the presence of Flu or RSV as well a good idea! At school, we are ensuring that classrooms have good ventilation, with additional daytime cleaning being performed: wiping down high-touch surfaces with disinfectant. Students will always have access to hand wash and sanitiser, with teachers maintaining the healthy personal hygiene regimes we have developed over the past couple of years.

All of this is obviously with the goal of minimising illness and maximising school attendance, to help our students continue to learn and grow at the fastest possible rate.

This data will be provided to the Australian Government to assist in the development of a consistent, national picture of the education needs of students with disability. The data provided to the Australian Government by the NSW Department of Education and Communities is provided in such a way that it cannot be used to identify any individual student or school. Students at Brooklyn Public School are very excited to be celebrating Education Week with our annual Open Day on Thursday 4th August.

Parents and carers are invited to visit our school on this day (one parent/carer per family). Following is an outline of events for your enjoyment.

The assembly will take place outdoors under the Covered Outdoor Learning Area (COLA). Invited guests will need to view the assembly from under the large tree outside the administration building, spaced 1.5 meters apart, in order to adhere to current guidelines.

The assembly will be held at 11:30am. We kindly ask guests not to mingle and remain seated for the duration of the assembly. We strongly encourage those attending to wear a mask.

Time Event

- 11:30am Welcome assembly and performances by our bands, choir and classes.
- 1:00pm Classroom visits due to COVID restrictions these cannot be held in the classroom, but you are able to join your child in an outdoor learning activity. Please ensure you are adhering to social distancing requirements.
- Short lunch break. Bring a picnic lunch 1:30pm to share with your child. Alternatively, adults may order lunch via the school lunch ordering system, under their child's name. These will be delivered to the designated child's class on the day. This is a pre-order system. Lunch orders for this day for yourself and child will need to be received no later than Monday 1st August with money in a brown paper bag to the school office. We will post a menu for the day shortly. You may enjoy your lunch on the oval, under the COLA or the FISH. Please ensure you are distancing adhering to social requirements.
- 2:10pm Anticipated conclusion of lunch.

Parents wishing to take their children home at this time may do so. We ask you to please sign your child out with Barb who will have sign out sheets available outside the administration building.

We look forward to having you join us, for either all, or part, of our program.

In the event of rain, unfortunately the event will be unable to go ahead. If cancelled, we will endeavour to provide a video link of performance items in due course.
