
















HZSS

Students have identified objects and subjects in sentences within their reading. Using this knowledge, they have been working on the 'ad/noun/is' strategy and identifying different types of verbs to create more interesting sentences.

The students in 3/2/1T have been creating interesting and detailed sentences using various grammatical techniques, such as coordinating conjunctions (FANBOY), verbs, prepositional phrases, and adjectives. They have been using books and images as inspiration and identifying the parts of each sentence they wrote.

We have been using the 'DADS' strategy (Dialogue, Action, Description, Show), to enhance the beginnings of their narratives to hook the reader. It was particularly challenging for some students who were not used to starting their narratives with action or dialogue. However over the last few weeks it has given the students a few more strategies to think about when starting a writing piece.



ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE UPCOMING BUSHFIRE SEASON

Dear parent/carer,

I am writing to advise you of bushfire emergency arrangements for our school this bushfire season.

Our school is in a bushfire prone area and is listed as Category 1 on the NSW Department of Education's bushfire risk register.

To ensure the health, safety and welfare of students and staff, the department has determined that on days when NSW Rural Fire Service declares a Catastrophic Fire Danger Rating for Brooklyn, our school will temporarily cease operations for the following day.

In addition, schools may be made non-operational due to changing higher risk conditions and advice from emergency services and the State Emergency Operations Centre.

We recommend that you download the <u>Parent App</u> and select to monitor advice from our school which will push notifications to you advising that the school is non-operational. We also recommend that you stay up to date with bushfire and grassfire activity by using the <u>Hazards Near Me</u> app (set a watch zone for your school area), and by monitoring local media. You can also review fire activity and alert levels on the RFS website.

The Fire Danger Rating does not mean there will be a bushfire, but rather weather conditions that could pose a high risk for a bushfire event. The measure is proactive to ensure staff, students and the community remain safe.

Our school will inform our school community after 4pm if there is a change to the operational status of the school for the following day. In the first instance all parents/carers will be sent a SKOOL LOOP message and email notifying that Brooklyn Public School will temporarily cease operations for the following day. To assist the school in contacting all families please ensure that you have provided us with up-to-date contact details.

EMERGENCY PLANNING AND ARRANGEMENTS DURING THE UPCOMING BUSHFIRE SEASON

Dear Community User,

I am writing to advise you that our school is in a bushfire prone area and is identified as Category 1 on the NSW Department of Education's bushfire risk register.

As a community user of our facilities, it is important that you are aware of and implement appropriate emergency preparation and response planning in accordance with the requirements of the *Work Health and Safety Act 2011*.

During the school term, when the NSW Rural Fire Service declares a Catastrophic Fire Danger Rating for Brooklyn, the NSW Department of Education's policy requires the school to temporarily cease operations for the following day. This means the school will be non-operational on these days. The school will inform the school community after 4 pm if there is a change to the operational status of the school for the following day.

In addition, schools may be made non-operational due to changing higher risk conditions and advice from Emergency Services and the State Emergency Operations Centre.

We recommend that you download the <u>Parent App</u> and select to monitor advice from our school which will push notifications to you advising that the school is non-operational.

It is important that you undertake appropriate planning and monitor bushfire conditions during the bushfire season and be ready to act when required. If there is bushfire activity in the vicinity of the school while you are there, you should contact the school during school hours or if after hours, ring Triple Zero (000) and seek advice.
