End of Term assembly

Last Day of Term 1 and First Day of Term 2

Staff return on Monday 29 April and will be working collaboratively with staff at Cowan Public School completing professional learning on using assessment to guide teaching and learning, using Learning Intentions and Success Criteria to strengthen learning tasks and building student vocabulary.

Brighter Beginnings Parent and Carer Hub

The Brighter Beginnings <u>Parent and Carer</u> <u>Information Hub</u> has launched to help parents and carers as they navigate the first 5 years of life, from pregnancy to age 5.

The hub brings together NSW and Federal Government resources as a one-stop-shop to find the information and tools they need to support their child's health and development during this time

Have your say about high school education in the Hornsby-Berowra area

The school community is taking part in community consultations relating to educational offerings for years 7-12 in the local area.

The NSW Department of Education wants to your views about high school enrolment decision-making and feedback on a range of proposals for future arrangements at Asquith Girls and Asquith Boys high schools. This includes:

- 1. Retaining the existing arrangement where families can choose between Asquith Boys or Asquith Girls high schools and one existing co-educational high school (either Ku-ring-gai High School or Turramurra High School as per designated intake areas).
- 2. Reclassifying Asquith Boys and Asquith Girls high schools to become two separate standalone medium-sized coeducational high schools, each servicing their own exclusive intake area community.
- 3.One large co-educational high school model spread across the existing Asquith Boys and Asquith Girls High School sites, comprised of one junior campus (Years 7, 8 and 9) and one senior campus (Years 10, 11 and 12) servicing a large intake area community.

Please note, in options B and C, Ku-ring-gai High School and Turramurra High School would each service their own exclusive intake area community, no longer sharing geographic drawing areas with single-sex high schools.

Surveys and workshops are confidential and cannot be used to identify any individual.

Students, parents/carers and staff from local high schools and primary schools can participate in the consultation process. The local community and special interest groups will also be invited to have their say.

The consultation period will finish on Friday 12 April. Surveys and workshops are confidential and cannot be used to identify any individual.

Skool Loop will continue to be used until the end Term 2, 2024. We still have a very small number of families who have not yet signed up to the Sentral Parent Portal. We ask that you please complete this step as soon as possible.

The Sentral for Parents app allows you to monitor your child's school journey simply and efficiently. You will find numerous smart features that help streamline your day. Receive messages and notifications from teachers, report absences and more. The Sentral for Parents app helps you stay connected and informed about your child's education.

Enrolment strategy

As part of Brooklyn Public School's initiative to continue to grow student enrolments, the school will work collaboratively with the Department of Education to open and implement a Brooklyn Public School Facebook social media page. The purpose of this page is to promote the wonderful things happening at Brooklyn Public School as well as celebrate the successes of the school, our students and our community.

Therefore, we are seeking your permission to allow the school/Department of Education to publish and/or disclose information about your child for the purposes of sharing their experiences with other students, informing the school and broader community about school and student activities and recording student participation in noteworthy projects or community service in line with the <u>Privacy and Personal Information Protection Act 1998 (NSW)</u>.

We respect that families may have completed this process during enrolment, but we understand that families may wish to change their child permissions. We request that all families please complete the general permission to publish and disclose information on School Bytes to ensure our records are accurate prior to the launch of the Brooklyn Public School Facebook Page.

Permission can be given on the School Bytes app. If after the 5 April, no changes have been made by families through the School Bytes app, we will continue to use the information provided on the student's enrolment forms.

Charges to accounts

1.Voluntary Contributions

Our school would not be able to provide the excellent range of services, activities and resources that your children enjoy without the payment of the school contribution from families.

Contributions from families assist to enhance educational programs across the school. NSW Government policy is that school contributions are voluntary. Voluntary contributions at Brooklyn Public School are being used to continue to enhance our children's learning and update classroom technology and teaching resources.

For 2024, the voluntary contribution is set to \$50 per student.

2.Online Maths and Reading programs

In 2024, we have reduced the cost of learning materials from \$110 previously to \$60 per student to cover online maths and reading programs. Mathletics and Reading programs will be charged separately. The maths and reading programs include:

- Mathletics Kindergarten to Year 6
- ABC Reading Eggs Kindergarten to Year 2
- Literacy Pro Year 3 to Year 6

Permission to use Literacy Pro will be sent home via the School Bytes app this week and permission to use this software can be provided directly on the app. If you do not wish for your child to use Literacy Pro, please email the school at <u>brooklyn-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au</u>

Student log ins for Literacy Pro will be attached to each student's home reading folder. So please ensure your child brings their homework in each Friday.

The cost of these reading programs for each student at Brooklyn Public School in 2024 is \$30.00 each.

You will receive two separate charges on your account titled "Mathletics 2024" and "Reading program 2024" for the online maths and reading programs.

CDC NSW school changes commencing Tuesday 02 April 2024 - UPDATED

Bus service changes to many routes on the North Shore and Upper North Shore areas will commence from 31/03/2024. Changes to school services commence Tuesday 02 April after Easter Monday.

Following some feedback, the PM 592 service to Brooklyn Wharf has been changed. It will now pick up opposite the school at 15:09pm, and arrive Hawkesbury River Station 15:12pm, to allow students more time and certainty to reach the ferry departing 15:20pm to Danger Island.

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Attendance

As we head into the end of the term it remains important that your child attends school every single day. Being at school is the best place for students to learn as well as to keep social connections and build life-long skills.

We understand that families are eager to see and reconnect with loved ones and take a welldeserved break, but please remember that planned travel should only be taken during scheduled school holidays.

Students should be at school every day during school terms, including until the end of term, unless they are sick or are absent for a justified reason.

Missing a day here or there may not seem like much, but absences add up and can negatively impact your child's learning and wellbeing. When your child misses one day per fortnight, that's 4 weeks of missed learning in one year. Over an entire school journey this adds up to 1 year of lost learning.

When it comes to attending school, every day matters If your child misses as little as 1 day per fortnight, they will miss 4 weeks of school per year, which adds up to over 1 year missed over their school life.
