Communication

At Brooklyn Public School, we value strong home-school partnerships, and encourage you to drop in and say hi or ask questions. Catching teachers in the morning can be challenging as they are getting their quality lessons ready for the day. If you have any concerns regarding your child's learning or wellbeing, or require a meeting time, please phone or email the school office at <u>brooklynp.school@det.nsw.edu.au</u> to make an appointment with the relevant staff member. Please do not email teachers directly, as they are not always checked in a timely manner. Staff are busy teaching and supporting our students. Emails from the school email address and Skool Loop will continue to be used as our main form of communication to families.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a point in time assessment of literacy and numeracy skills. Each year students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in tests for writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar, and punctuation) and numeracy.

NAPLAN will take place from Wednesday 13 March to Monday 25 March 2024.

NAPLAN tests are just one part of our school learning assessment program and questions are primarily based on knowledge, understanding and skills gained from the prior year of schooling. In preparation for NAPLAN 2024, our school will undertake activities to help students to become familiar with the format and functionality of the online tests. These activities are not an assessment of student ability and will not be marked. Students and parents can access the public demonstration site (https://www.nap.edu.au/onlineassessment/public-demonstration-site) to familiarise themselves with NAPLAN and the types of questions and tools available. Excessive preparation for NAPLAN is not required nor recommended.

If you have any questions about NAPLAN, please contact your child's teacher.

Attendance

By law, children are expected to be at school each day unless they are sick. All absences from school must be explained within 7 days. These can be via phone or via email. Absences without a justified reason continue to remain unjustified absences.

Please contact the office either by phone or email if your child is absent for more than 2 days. Exemption applications for leave more than 5 days long are available on our school website or from the office. Should your child be late to school or need to leave early, they must be signed in/out by an adult, with a reason being given for their lateness or for the need to leave early, and the child must be dropped off or picked up at the classroom. Please make appointments outside of school for outside of school hours where possible.

Respect at School posters

This term, you will notice new posters around the school that aim to help support a safe and respectful culture at our school.

These posters are part of an initiative to remind everybody to treat our hard-working school staff with kindness and respect. Every school community around the state is very different. While most schools are respectful and harmonious, violence and unsafe behaviour in any form is not acceptable in schools. School staff and students have the right to learn and work in safe and respectful learning environments.

With that in mind, I encourage you to join everyone at our school in getting behind this important work to make a positive change.

We value our partnerships with you to support our students to learn, grow, and belong. It is up to us – the school and the parent-body - to be good respectful role models to our students. Together, we can create a safe and harmonious environment for our students and staff. I hope you will support this initiative. What do you need to do? It is easy: Please treat our students and staff with kindness and respect, at all times. We are here to help you. I invite you to contact me if you have any questions.

Anti-Racism Contact Officer

The Anti-Racism Contact Officer (ARCO) is a teacher or executive member of staff who has been nominated by the principal or staff to support anti-racism education in the school. The ARCO plays an important role in assisting and working collaboratively with the staff to implement three major aspects of the Anti-Racism Policy:

- Promote anti-racism education
- Support complaint-handling
- Monitor incidents of racism

NSW Student learning library

The NSW Student learning library is a suite of learning resources which are accessible for teachers, parents and carers, and students to be used in class or at home.

The resources are aligned with new syllabuses and have been quality assured by educational professionals within the department. The new resources will supplement and complement other resources being provided by the department, including units developed by department curriculum experts to support the roll-out of new syllabuses.

The library currently contains K-2 English and Mathematics learning resources. The remaining K-10 learning resources are to be released over the next 3-5 years aligned to the new NSW syllabus rollout.

Bike safety

Parents and carers are responsible for a student's travel to and from school. Schools take over responsibility and duty of care for the student once they enter the school premises.

Primary aged students are safest when they are supervised by an adult when riding a bike to and from school. Children under 16 can now ride on the footpath unless there are signs prohibiting cycling.

Every school's surrounding traffic environment is different. Every school's entry and exit rules for students are different and are therefore managed differently.

The department encourages riding as one way to be physically active. Sometimes the busy roads and conditions around the outside of the school can impact student safety. Please support your children who are riding to and from school to watch for traffic if crossing the road and use the crossing where possible. It is also important to be on the lookout when passing driveways.

Curriculum news

SPELLING K-6

What is it?

Spelling focuses on using a range of strategies to spell high-frequency words as well as less familiar words for different writing purposes.

Things to try at home with K-2 students:

- Read as much as possible and talk about the language and words within the text.
- Cut out individual letters from magazines to make high-frequency words. Glue the letters in the correct order to make the words.
- Talk about how some words can be made plural by adding the letter 's' at the end. For example, dog/dogs, car/cars.
- Make word jumbles for high-frequency or sight words for your child to rearrange the letters to find the word. This could be done using fridge magnet letters. For example, present your child with the letters a- t- c which they then re-arrange into c- a- t. Help them with a clue if they are having trouble, like it purs when it's happy.
- Investigate words which sound the same but have different spellings and meaning (homophones). For example, great/grate, stare/stair, wood/would, knight/night.
- Investigate words which look and sound the same but have different meanings (homonyms). For example, bark on a tree / bark the sound a dog makes, rose a flower in a garden / rose went upwards, right to be correct / right the opposite of left.
- Show how to use a dictionary to discover the correct spelling of words.
- Encourage the See it. Say it. Write It. Method

 This strategy is really important for breaking down words to see the connections between the skills.

Types of Spelling Knowledge

Students need to understand how to use banks of known words, word origins, base words, suffixes and prefixes, morphemes, spelling patterns and generalisations to learn and spell new words. The four forms of spelling knowledge include:

Phonological knowledge:

an understanding of phonemic awareness (being able to hear the sounds in words and manipulate them) and alphabetic awareness (knowledge of letter sound correspondence).

Visual knowledge:

understanding the way words and letter combinations look.

Morphemic knowledge:

understanding the meaning of words and how spellings differ when they change form.

Etymological knowledge: understanding the origin of words.

Things to try at home for older students:

- Talk about how prefixes, such as un-, re-, and dis-, change the meaning of base words. For example, happy/unhappy, play/replay and agree/disagree
- Investigating the origin of interesting words as you read and write together. For example, words such as triangle come from Greek and Latin origins with tri meaning three. Other tri words include tricycle (3 wheels) and tripod (3 legs)
- Use technology to look up word meanings and commonly misspelt words.
- Find the fun in language discuss 'punny' language in shop signs and commercials.
- Older kids might be interested in word games such as findawords, crosswords, crozzles.

What a start to the year! KD have been so busy. We have settled in quickly with everyone eager to be at school and ready to learn. Our first day was busy with learning about the school, painting, drawing our portraits and getting to know how 'big' school works. At the end of the day we proudly finished up wearing our 'First Day' crowns.

English

We have had lots of fun to start the year listening to sounds in words. We are clapping parts of words (syllables) and hunting for rhyming words. We have read lots of books, learning that print has meaning and a direction. We can count the words in a sentence and have been learning some initial sounds.

Maths



As we eagerly await the Big Band Blow, let's extend a round of applause to these remarkable students for bringing a touch of musical brilliance to our school halls! Bravo!










