Have your say about high school education in the Hornsby-Berowra area

The school community is taking part in community consultations relating to educational offerings for years 7-12 in the local area.

The NSW Department of Education wants to your views about high school enrolment decision-making and feedback on a range of proposals for future arrangements at Asquith Girls and Asquith Boys high schools. This includes:

1. Retaining the existing arrangement where families can choose between Asquith Boys or Asquith Girls high schools and one existing co-educational high school (either Ku-ring-gai High School or Turramurra High School as per designated intake areas).
2. Reclassifying Asquith Boys and Asquith Girls high schools to become two separate standalone medium-sized coeducational high schools, each servicing their own exclusive intake area community.
3. One large co-educational high school model spread across the existing Asquith Boys and Asquith Girls High School sites, comprised of one junior campus (Years 7, 8 and 9) and one senior campus (Years 10, 11 and 12) servicing a large intake area community.

Please note, in options B and C, Ku-ring-gai High School and Turramurra High School would each service their own exclusive intake area community, no longer sharing geographic drawing areas with single-sex high schools.

Surveys and workshops are confidential and cannot be used to identify any individual.

Students, parents/carers and staff from local high schools and primary schools can participate in the consultation process. The local community and special interest groups will also be invited to have their say.

Here are some lifetime skills that your child will develop:




- They will stop and think before engaging in new or potentially dangerous activities.


Communication with you

We encourage our students to get involved by adding a touch of orange to their uniform. An example could be scarves, headbands, ribbons, or even socks.


We will celebrate Harmony Day by making artworks and completing learning tasks that celebrate our Harmony Day theme that 'Everyone Belongs'.

Our students were part of the mass choir and they were the best part of the show! We are so lucky to have teachers go above and beyond for our students.





Daily Emotional Check-ins

We are utilising the *Life Skills Go* program each day to allow students the opportunity to tell us how they are feeling and why. Teachers can use this information to better support students, as well as use the data to track readiness for learning.

Bus Safety

Getting to and from the bus stop

- Families are responsible for getting their child to and from the bus stop safely.
- Always supervise your child until they are at least 10 and hold their hand when walking to and from the bus stop or interchange and when crossing the road.
- When waiting for the bus, hold hands and wait as far back from the passing traffic as possible.

Travelling on the bus

When travelling on the bus, students are to be sitting in the seat facing the front of the bus. They are not to move around the bus or switch seats. This is for their own safety.

Getting off the bus

When travelling by bus, your child is most at risk in the minutes after they get off the bus.

Meet your child AT the bus stop or interchange after school. NEVER wait on the opposite side of the road and call them across. If you cannot meet your child, organise for a trusted adult to take your place.

Always wait until the bus has gone, then use a safe place to cross.

Talk with your child about what to do:

- if you are delayed and cannot meet them as usual
- if they catch the wrong bus
- if they get off the bus at the wrong bus stop.

Crossing the road

Together, choose the safest place to cross the road and talk about:

STOP! one step back from the kerb

LOOK! continuously both ways

LISTEN! for the sounds of approaching traffic

THINK! whether it is safe to cross

Keep checking as you cross the road.






Mr Winspear 6-4W



Maths


6-4W have been learning to represent and order numbers up to 3 decimal places. The students have been using hands on resources to consolidate their theoretical knowledge.
